



## 2024 Statement of Account

Dear Parents and Careers,

Every year the school, in conjunction with the Finance Committee, sets a schedule of costs for students attending the school. These costs provide for a range of extras not covered by the funding allocation, which comes from the Department of Education. An explanation of these costs across all the grades is below.

**As per previous years we have condensed the fees that are billed at the start year for this year and most incursions and excursions will be invoiced separately closer to the time of the event, once confirmed.**

<b>School Contribution (Voluntary)</b>	Assists with purchasing and maintaining special equipment, developing teaching resources in all key learning areas, providing special learning programs and support services, producing newsletters and special information booklets, purchasing library books and computer software, purchasing sporting equipment and classroom teaching aids, purchasing computer tablets, interactive whiteboards and maintaining technology, all of which enriches students' learning. This is a voluntary contribution.
<b>Mandatory Subject Levies</b>	Provides classroom items for English, Mathematics, Science, History, Creative Arts, Geography, IT, paint, art paper, various other media products, duplicating class worksheets and other learning activity materials.
<b>Mandatory Workbooks</b>	Includes textbooks, workbooks, home readers, Mathletics, Reading Eggs and other online subscriptions, activity magazines, pencil grips etc according to grade requirements.
<b>Mandatory Mathletics License Fee</b>	All students receive a logon for Mathletics. An award-winning online maths program to help students build confident through personalised learning, exciting games and mastery challenges. Engaging, fun and aligned to the Australian curriculum.
<b>Life Education</b>	All students attend 'Healthy Harold' van at school for grade appropriate personal development instruction.
<b>Make My Own Lunch</b>	Years 3-6 participate in a nutrition talk and make their own healthy wrap or salad jar.
<b>Year K-6 Green Day</b>	A varied program of environmental awareness activities.
<b>Sportspro Program</b>	Professional coaches take all students through a rigorous sporting program throughout the year for all years. This year will see Sportspro based at the school 5 days per week and an increase in the delivery of programs from 8 weeks per term to every week.
<b>Year 3-6 Swimming Carnival</b>	Swimming Carnival Years 3-6 and those Year 2 students turning 8 may opt in.
<b>Year 5 Dancesport Challenge</b>	A program incorporating social skills and dance for Year 5 only, delivered by a professional instructor.
<b>Year 5 and 6 Interrelate</b>	Year 5 and 6 participate in a program 'Moving into the Teen Years'.
<b>Expressions of Elanora Art Program – Year K-6</b>	Students participate in art lesson with specialised art teachers. Included in the fee is the cost of art supplies and materials, art exhibition entry and final artwork to take home.
<b>Amplify Music Program Years K-6</b>	Weekly online music lessons to address the core subject of music in the creative arts curriculum. Each lesson meets outcome needs and provides fun, enjoyable music lessons in a contemporary way.
<b>The Resilience Project - Wellbeing Years K-6</b>	Delivers emotionally engaging programs and provides evidence-based, practical wellbeing strategies to build resilience.
